Peace and Social Justice Committee

The Peace and Social Justice committee helps Boulder Meeting fulfill our responsibilities to the Peace Testimony and for social, economic and environmental justice, with attention to equity, racism, poverty, privilege, class-ism, ageism, sexism, homophobia and discrimination of all sorts, sustainability, homelessness, and illness/wellness. Do we "live in the virtue of that life and power that takes away the occasion of all wars"?

Duties

To create avenues for a religious witness of our peace and social justice concerns.

- To provide information and involvement opportunities for peace and justice to the Meeting, including Young Friends, through presentations, the bulletin board, and suggestions for library purchases.
- To consider requests from the wider community for funding of peace and social justice concerns and to propose line items for the annual budget reflecting such requests. To monitor existing budget items to ensure their continuing needfulness and to change them where appropriate, using such knowledge as the committee itself possesses and consulting others where necessary.
- To increase Boulder-area participation in peace and justice work by fostering communication and collaboration with active organizations and faith communities.

Meetings: Usually monthly. Other meetings may be added, as needed for the support of specific projects.

Size/Tenure: Size may vary from 8 to 15 people. Tenure is for an indefinite period, reviewed annually.
